LPRCA Annual General Meeting

Natalia Moudrak, Director, Natural Infrastructure Adaptation Program (NIAP), Intact Centre on Climate Adaptation will be speaking at Long Point Region Conservation Authority's (LPRCA) Annual General Meeting on Friday, February 24.

The quest to find solutions and adaptation strategies to climate change and extreme weather events is spurring discussions between the environmental, economic and social sectors while forging new collaborations with partners that may have seemed unlikely in the past.

Ms. Moudrak's presentation titled, "Weather Gone Wild: Financial Markets Are Paying Attention," will, outline the challenges that extreme weather and flooding present to Canada's financial markets, link repeated flooding to elevated risks of mortgage defaults and profile the need for immediate climate adaptation action.

"Extreme weather, climate change, drought and floods present risks to the communities we serve and our conservation business," notes LPRCA General Manager Cliff Evanitski. "Our speaker will talk about flood-resiliency work being carried out at the Intact Centre on Climate Adaptation and lessons learned from engaging financial audiences," he added.

As a Director of NIAP, Natalia is responsible for its development, implementation and continuous improvement.
